Rock away the years



The easy warmth, natural beauty and rich tradition of Pinehurst Resort have drawn people here for more than one hundred years. From the moment Boston soda magnate James Walker Tufts created this New England-style retreat, its fresh, pine scented air and unhurried pace have been restoring souls and rejuvenating spirits.

Over the years, celebrities, dignitaries, business leaders, presidents and legendary athletes from all over the world have escaped to this quiet Southern respite. Bing Crosby, Will Rogers, Annie Oakley, Amelia Earhart, Oprah Winfrey and Barack Obama have assembled in Pinehurst's boardrooms, dined in its restaurants and danced in its ballrooms. And the greatest golfers to ever play the game — from Ben Hogan to Arnold Palmer to Jack Nicklaus to Phil Mickelson — have walked the lush fairways of its challenging courses.

With eight golf courses and more than 100 years of tradition, Pinehurst is considered the birthplace of golf in America. Legendary Scottish golf architect Donald Ross made the Village of Pinehurst his home, designing course Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4. Since then, the resort has continued to grow with four more courses

designed by Ellis Maples, Tom Fazio and Rees Jones. More championships have been contested at Pinehurst than anywhere else in America. And, by 2014, Pinehurst No. 2 will be the only course in the world to have hosted all five major USGA championships.

Not all play at Pinehurst requires a tee time, however. Along with 144 holes of some of the best golf in the country, you'll find an award-winning spa to soothe your body and awaken your senses. This 31,000-square-foot oasis features every indulgence, including his and hers saunas, steam and whirlpool areas and climate-controlled treatment suites designed for private couples-only massage. And you can choose from a host of sensory therapies using natural botanicals from the local landscape.

While your senses of touch and smell are easily satisfied at the spa, you can appease your sense of taste almost anywhere at the resort. From the endless Southern breakfast buffet at the Carolina Dining Room to a casual lunch at the Donald Ross Grill to cocktails and appetizers at the newly expanded Ryder Cup Lounge, eight unique dining options await you before you ever step off the resort campus.

Just a short walk away in the historic Village of Pinehurst, you'll find still more charming pubs and eateries. Take a tour of the Village on one of our complimentary guest bikes or hear some interesting local lore on an enchanting horse-drawn

rooms and period décor. The 45 rooms of the charming Manor Inn offer the comfort of a casual golfer's lodge while spacious Villas with shared parlor areas and private condominiums serve foursomes and families alike.
