Colonial Williamsburg Hotels range in price from moderate to luxury, with meeting and event spaces ranging from an intimate board room for 18 seated at a hand-carved cherry table to 1,400 comfortably seated in general session. The hotel group takes its name and identity from the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, the non-profit center for history and citizenship, but the hotel facilities are 21st-century in amenities, comfort and technology.

"We routinely hear from meeting planners and decision makers that the facilities are very different from what they expected," said Perry Goodbar, vice president, hospitality sales, services and business development for the Colonial Williamsburg Company. "The phrase, 'Wow...I had no idea...' is common." The Colonial Williamsburg Hotel group has invested nearly \$200 million dollars in improvements to conference hotels and facilities over the past several years.

Conference attendees can relive history or make a little history of their own – meeting where this great country's Founding Fathers lived and worked. All revenues from the hotels, dining (more than 20 restaurants), shopping (50 to

choose from), and recreation (golf, spa, biking, hiking, tennis, lawn bowling) support the preservation, research and education mission of the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation. More than 85 years ago, John D. Rockefeller Jr. believed Virginia's colonial capitol should be restored and became Colonial Williamsburg's founding benefactor.

Colonial Williamsburg is a very diverse experience. The Museums of Colonial Williamsburg include the DeWitt Wallace Decorative Arts Museum, the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum and Bassett Hall, the home where the Rockefellers lived while overseeing the restoration. In the Revolutionary City, guests witness life during the years leading to the American Revolution and the birth of a new nation. Colonial Williamsburg offers a mix of culture, learning, fun and relaxation, with hotels, golf and spa located adjacent to Colonial Williamsburg's Historic Area. The abundance of activities delights conference attendees, spouses and meeting planners with programs that are planned and executed by Colonial Williamsburg staff.

Williamsburg is a "must visit" location in the Mid-Atlantic region. It's

a quaint, walkable town full of shops, galleries and restaurants. Some call it romantic. Others call it charming, but whatever the description, Williamsburg offers Southern hospitality in a setting like no other place.


Three conference hotels — The Woodlands Hotel and Suites (moderate), the Williamsburg Lodge (upper upscale) and the Williamsburg Inn (luxury) — offer more than 67,000 square feet of indoor function space and an additional 25,000 square feet of outdoor gardens and unique settings. Williamsburg is serviced by three airports ranging from 20 to 45 minutes away with 200 daily flights and is centrally located between Richmond and Norfolk, Va. off Interstate 64.

Meetings have been integral to American heritage since Thomas Jefferson, George Washington, Patrick Henry and others debated independence from King George in the Apollo Room of the Raleigh Tavern in Williamsburg in the 18th century.
